

I AM A TOTAL NECK BREATHER.

I only breathe through the hole in my neck (aka Stoma.)

I am NOT a trach patient

who can still breathe through my nose and mouth.



I ONLY breathe through my stoma, located here

I cannot breathe via my mouth/nose

If I require oxygen it can ONLY be given via my neck stoma. I can be bagged using a child or infant mask over my stoma.

If I require intubation, the preferred device is the "Larynoflex"



If not available, a standard cuffed endotracheal tube of the correct diameter should be inserted into my neck stoma.



Do not occlude the carina (average depth 8.3 cm).

Post - Op


I AM A TOTAL NECK BREATHER.

I only breathe through the hole in my neck (aka Stoma.)


I am **NOT** a trach patient who can still breathe through my nose and mouth.

I am wearing a voice prosthesis, leave it in place, if possible. If removed, place a rubber catheter in the puncture to keep it open and to prevent aspiration.

I may have mucus buildup post surgery. This will need to be suctioned out if I am not fully awake. Normally it can be coughed out.



Please take note of the Voice Prosthesis and do not suction it loose.



If I do **NOT** have an adhesive base plate and HME filter on then I am to be considered **NON-VOCAL**.
